Mezei Rocks the House at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg

Winnipeg, Manitoba (October 21, 2007) –The 7th stop on the elite Professional Bull Riders (PBR) Rocky Cup Series presented by Dickies brought fans to a roar as Mezei rode his final bull of the event for the Championship and \$8,411.50 in earnings. Mezei marvelled the fans as he tamed Dansey & Braithwaite's bull Boogie Man to an 89 marked score and the Winnipeg Invitational Championship.

<u>Rocky Boot Bonus:</u> Devon Mezei (Scandia, AB) was awarded the \$1,000 Rocky Boot Bonus and a new pair of Rocky boots by possessing the highest combined marked score of 169. Saturday's performance Mezei received a marked score of 81.5 in the long-go taming Braithwaite Ranches bull Rock Island Line. On Sunday, Mezei received a marked score of 87.5 on Girletz Rodeo Stock bull Canyonaro.

Upon the conclusion of the Canadian season, the top ranked rider will go on to compete and represent Canada at the PBR World Finals.
